- The judge has the power to remove any exhibit to the class to which he/she considers it is better suited.

Nomination Fee: \$1.00 (to pay for the winner's name on the Honour Board). Prize: \$100 cash.



- 3. Miniature Garden, arranged in a soup plate, need not be growing. Trophy donated by Margaret Keane.
